The company has continued to meet its budget objective for the financial year 2019/2020. For the quarter October 2019 – December 2019, profit before tax was \$5,052K which was \$468K (10%) above budget. The result however was \$174K (3%) lower than the same period last year.
Sales for the period were \$49,246K which was \$328K (1%) lower than budget and \$1,064 (2%) lower than last year
The financial strength of the company remains strong with a current ratio of 1:1.81 and a debt to equity ratio of .34:1

Management is not aware of any events that would materially affect the profitability of the group other than the rate of the country's economic growth. Outlook for the rest of the year is to achieve the same level of profitability as 2018/19.
